r. Sage Bolte lives in Northern Virginia with her husband Jeff and their three children. She is a licensed clinical social worker who works with people impacted by cancer. Sage specialises in how cancer and its treatments impact sexual function and intimacy in relationships. Along with her area of interest in sexuality, she also spends a lot of time working with and writing about young adult cancer survivors. She has done numerous national and international presentations and has also contributed to a number of publications on both of these topics. Dr. Bolte has three chapters on these topics awaiting publication in the new Oxford Press' Professional Handbook for Oncology Social Work. Additionally, she is passionate about educating health care professionals on how to approach the topic of sexual health with patients.

In 2008, Dr. Bolte received the American Cancer Society's Doctoral Training Grant. She received her PhD in Social Work from The Catholic University of America School of Social Service where her dissertation explored the sexual selves of young adult cancer survivors as compared to their healthy peers. Along with her consulting work, Sage is currently the Director of Life with Cancer®, a not for profit support and education program of Inova Cancer Services.
